Summit Counseling

- **Leadership.** Summit is the leading catalyst promoting behavioral health and emotional well-being in North Fulton County.
- **Experience.** Summit is a trusted and treasured community partner with 30 years of faithful service to Greater North Atlanta.
- **Vision.** Summit envisions a community where everyone, without exception, (children, teens, adults and seniors), has full access to professional, spiritually integrated, behavioral healthcare.



- **Trust.** Summit is a Guidestar Gold Star Award recipient ranking among the top 5% of non-profits nation-wide in financial transparency.
- **Community.** Summit is actively striving to serve every segment of our community from emotional survival for police officers to raising the bar of mental health with bartenders.
- **Satisfaction.** Summit customer satisfaction survey conducted in 2019 indicated that 83% of Summit clients "strongly agree" and 16% "agree" that they are satisfied with the counseling and care they have received at The Summit.

Early Intervention. Summit is committed to treating youth. 75% of mental illness presents itself by the age of 24. Because early intervention is a priority, 66% of Summit clients are between age 3 and 24.

- **Awareness.** Summit's staff conducts 200+ events annually through our partners, in an effort to raise awareness regarding mental health issues.
- **Education.** Summit conducts pro bono best practice trainings such as Mental Health 101, ASSIST Suicide Training, Mental Health First Aid & Trusted Adult Training.



- **Affordability.** Summit works year-round to raise \$1M+ each year to provide Client Assistance Funds and program services and to make counseling available to all seeking help.
- **Accessibility.** Summit is a rapidly expanding network with a Main Office, 5 Satellite locations and 28 Summit OnSite locations.
- **Partnership.** Summit proudly partners with dozens of major community stakeholder organizations to maximize missional impact.

- **Collaboration.** Summit leads the North Fulton Mental Health Collaborative convening 50 to 100 community leaders monthly to address topics and solutions related to behavioral health.
- **Staff.** Summit has a total staff of over 50 personnel, 37 therapists in 33 locations, and is well positioned to "move mountains" when it comes to behavioral health in North Fulton and beyond.
- **Students.** Summit is the largest provider of school-based therapy for students in north Fulton through the work of 17 Summit OnSite therapists in 28 schools.



- **Supervision.** Summit's therapists receive supervision and training to grow in their profession and rate the quality of their supervision as 'very high'.
- **Integration.** Summit provides an integrated approach that promotes healing of Body, Mind, Spirit and Community.
- **Specialization.** Summit offers multiple areas of specialization to serve a broad spectrum of people including such services as play therapy, alcohol and substance abuse, EMDR trauma therapy and Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT) for emotional dysregulation.



- **Quality.** Summit employs Master's level, state licensed therapists who provide professional, integrated counseling.
- **Accountability.** Summit is governed by 12 Board of Directors that meet monthly with the Executive Leadership Team to ensure accountability.
- **Partnership.** Summit partners with local schools, businesses, churches and healthcare organizations to meet their counseling, education and consulting needs.




- **Accreditation.** Summit is fully accredited by The Solihten Institute insuring administrative, clinical, and fiscal accountability to our clients, donors and supporters.
- **Community.** Summit serves our community by providing counseling, consulting and educational services that are responsive to community needs and strengthen our community.
- **Confidentiality.** Summit is strongly committed to client privacy and confidentiality at every level of the counseling experience.



- **Diversity.** Summit is committed to being an inclusive community that increasingly reflects and supports a diversified Atlanta area population.
- **Scheduling.** Summit's front office first impression team is committed to helping clients select the counselor who is the best fit possible for them.
- **Resilience.** Summit recently experienced a devastating flood at its Main Office. Within two business days the entire operation was back up and running at near full capacity.



- **Play.** Summit has 8 therapists on staff that offer play therapy to help children ages 3-11 better express themselves to their therapists.
- **Crisis Response.** Summit responds pro bono to our community partners with a tailored team of therapists in times of crisis such as suicide that effects a school.
- **Groups.** Summit provides a wide array of groups for all ages from social skills for kids to grief support groups for adults and much more.



Expanding ACCESSIBILITY



Summit OnSite is a partnership between Fulton County Schools and Summit Counseling Center to offer confidential mental health therapy. Conveniently located in 28 area public schools, students have the option to see their therapist at school during the day or at one of our offsite locations in the evening or on weekends.

This flexibility allows the therapist to quickly intervene so children get the help they need to achieve their best at school. From anxiety, bullying, depression, divorce, grief, self-harm, substance abuse or suicidal ideation, Summit is "OnSite" for Students.



One Therapist's Story, Our Client, Maria*

I remember the first time I met Maria. She walked into my office with her head down, hood up, and tentatively sat in the chair opposite me. She continued looking down as she told me that she didn't know how to keep living any longer. She shared feeling hopeless and lost without a purpose or belief that anything could be positive for her. When we started talking she slowly shared that as a child she had been continually victimized by a family member. Afterwards whenever she told anyone about it, they told her to stop over-exaggerating. She felt alone and like no one cared what happened to her. Maria's only way of knowing how to deal with those feelings was hurting herself repeatedly. Over the next few months, we worked together to help her find hope. After the first month, she met my eyes and smiled when telling me that she stopped self-harming. After the third month, she told me that she couldn't remember the last time she thought about killing herself. In our last session together, we almost started crying as we talked about how far she has come. She smiled and told me about her hopes for college and the friendships she was developing. Maria said that even after all she had faced, she knew that she was worth something. She told me that she finally felt like she was the main character in her life story and that it could be a story worth telling.



Summit OnSite provided 2,757 counseling sessions to 487 at risk students in Fulton & DeKalb Counties in 2018-19 alone.


