Beth: A Client Story

Beth (not her real name) is an emergency room nurse who came to The Summit for help dealing with trauma flashbacks. She is one of those kind-hearted heroes who volunteered to work with COVID-19 patients in New York when the Coronavirus pandemic began. During her time in New York, she worked 7 days a week, 12 hours a day for 5 weeks, surrounded by disease, death and grief.

Compelled by her faith, she felt it important that those dying didn't die alone and that they were comforted in their final moments on this earth. She also felt it important that their bodies were treated with dignity and respect after they passed. Beth returned home exhausted and traumatized, finding it difficult to detach from the sights, sounds and smells of her time on the COVID-19 unit.

Beth started working with her Summit therapist a couple of months after her return. During their third session, they worked on de-traumatizing her memory. At the beginning of the session, Beth stated that her anxiety and horror were at a 9 on a scale of 0 to 10. By the end of the session, she said she could remember the events, but felt they were at a 3 out of 10 and she felt more sad, than traumatized. The following week, she reported she no longer was experiencing any nightmares or intrusive thoughts about the events and found herself surprisingly laughing in amazement at how the anxiety had just melted away.

This is the joy we get to participate in at The Summit – watching the power of healing in action, watching people find freedom from the tyranny of their trauma, watching them embrace love and truth and ultimately find peace of mind.



2019-20 Highlights Response to Covid-19

Austerity Measures

Confronting the financial challenges posed by COVID-19, The Summit took stringent measures to reduce expenses through payroll and operational reductions while being guided by a commitment to continue to meet the social and emotional needs of our community in the process.

Video Therapy

Since the onset of COVID-19 was announced in mid-March of 2020, every Summit therapist completed a 12-hour certification program in teletherapy and has access to their own HIPAA compliant Zoom (video conference) platform to serve their clients anytime that it is the best available option.

Today The Summit's counselors are "meeting people where they are" at home or school, in their office or ours. This also provides counselors the ability to conveniently and legally serve clients anywhere in the entire state of Georgia; something that was not viable previously.

The COVID-19 pandemic is having a significant impact on our mental health. According to a recent CDC study:

All Adults



40% reported an **adverse mental/ behavioral health condition**.

11% seriously considered **suicide**.

Young Adults (18-24)



25% seriously considered **suicide**.

2019-20 Highlights (cont.) Mental Health Awareness & Suicide Prevention

The topics of mental health and the growing suicide epidemic continued to be a growing concern over the previous 12 months. In 2019-2020 The Summit therapists and partners conducted 200+ mental health awareness and education events to an estimated 2,000 adults in our community, both in person and through video conferencing.

Mental illness does not discriminate... anyone can be affected, regardless of age, race, religion or income. However, people are still afraid to talk about it due to shame, misunderstanding, negative attitudes and fear of discrimination.

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2019-20 Highlights (cont.) **Summit Onsite Program** (School-Based Therapy)

Research shows that students are more likely to seek counseling when services are available in schools. That is why The Summit partners with local private schools and public school districts to provide school-based counseling services in our community.

This past year, 16 Summit OnSite therapists provided services to 1665 students in 28 Fulton & DeKalb County elementary, middle and high schools throughout the north Atlanta suburbs.

School-based services include: Individual and group therapy for students, consultation with school administrators, mental health awareness presentations for parents and teachers and suicide prevention training for students, staff and parents.



1 in 6 U.S. youth aged 6-17 experience a mental health disorder each year.

The Summit is committed to creating a well-informed and stigma free community by encouraging open conversations and education on mental health topics. Workshops included the following trainings:

Signs of Suicide Trusted Adult Training (SOS), Mental Health 101, Maternal Mental Health, Building Resilience in Youth, Soul Shop, Mental Health First Aid (MHFA), and Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST)

2019-20 Highlights (cont.) Diversity Training in Schools & The Workplace

Cultivating greater understanding and acceptance in the melting pot that is the United States of America was front and center this past year. Racial equality and social justice are prominent in our nation's headlines and among our highest felt needs as a society and local community.

In FY 2019-20 the Summit hosted trainings empowering hundreds of students and adults to empathize on a greater level with those from different backgrounds than themselves.

Embracing diversity is more than inclusion... it's about listening, learning and understanding the unique things about one's race, color, ethnicity, sexual orientation, religion, gender, age and physical and mental abilities that make each of us different and unique individuals. The Summit designed the **DREAM Diversity Workshop** to be an interactive experience in diversity sensitivity and social justice in the areas of:

Making an Impact at a Local Level

Online Mental Health Screenings

Taking an online screening is a quick and easy way to 'help meet people where they are' to determine whether one is experiencing symptoms of a mental health condition. The Summit provided well over a thousand online free mental health screenings to both individuals and organizations in FY 2019-20.

Designed to provide a safe and anonymous way for individuals to check in on their mental health, our online self-assessments allow users to screen for the following conditions:

Alcohol or Substance Misuse, Anxiety, Bipolar, Depression, Disordered Eating, Opioid Misuse, Posttraumatic Stress, Psychosis, Well-Being

2019-20 Highlights (cont.) FY 2019–20 Fund-Raising Events

The Summit held five successful, seasonal fund-raising efforts in Fiscal Year 2019-20. Each event provided a meaningful opportunity for The Summit's supporters to come together to make a huge difference by raising funds to help The Summit's therapists *"meet people where (ever) they are."*


Summer - Summit Gives (Fiscal) Year End Giving Campaign

Each year The Summit and supporters have risen to the challenge to serve the growing number of clients in need of behavioral health services.


2818 Clients Served in 2019-2020


