Claire's Journey: A Client Story

Claire (not her real name) is a high school student who started to see a Summit therapist after coming in for a required suicide assessment. She had seen several therapists in the past and this was her 4th suicide assessment. She had also been self-harming for the past 2 years with nothing helping the suicidal thoughts or self-harm. After making sure she was safe, we started working together using DBT. She and her parent did our classes and started learning skills and using them at home. In individual sessions, we worked together on making sure she knew when to use skills and how to identify/understand herself and her emotions.

Claire started to slowly make progress and we started to see her lengthen time in between self-harming instances. She also brought her DBT book to church and shared with youth pastors. Eventually she went a month without a suicidal thought. Then it went longer and longer. She brought her DBT book to school and started sharing skills with teachers. It's been 4 years and she only comes in occasionally for therapy and check in. She now goes to school, has a job, and has positive relationships with family and friends. She feels more in control of her life and her emotions!

DBT is one of the top supported evidence-based therapies used to address suicidality, self-harm, treatment-resistant depression, anxiety, bipolar, trauma, and borderline personality disorder. Using concrete tools along with focus on mindfulness, DBT teaches clients to manage their emotional distress by finding balance between the dialectics in our lives.



"I am grateful for our mental health partner Summit Counseling who has been 1. available to listen to our students' needs and 2. willing to support our students who need it most. 2021-22 Highlights

Summit Onsite Program (School-Based Therapy)

Research shows that students are more likely to seek counseling when services are available in schools. That is why The Summit partners with local private schools and public school districts to provide school-based counseling services in our community.

This past year, 17 Summit OnSite therapists provided services to 658 students in 31 elementary, middle and high schools throughout the north Atlanta suburbs.

School-based services include: Individual and group therapy for students, consultation with school administrators, mental health awareness presentations for parents and teachers and suicide prevention training for students, staff and parents.



2021-22 Highlights (cont.) FY 2021–22 Fund-Raising Events

The Summit held three successful, seasonal fund-raising efforts in Fiscal Year 2021-22. Each event provided a meaningful opportunity for The Summit's supporters to come together to make a huge difference by raising funds to help The Summit's therapists *"meet people where (ever) they are."*



Winter: Summit Rocks Matching Campaign

The Summit was unable to hold the Summit Rocks concert in October as planned. The Summit pivoted to hold an online fundraising campaign called the Summit Rocks Matching Campaign with a goal of \$200,000. \$100,000 were secured in anonymous matching funds ahead of the campaign launch. The campaign kicked off in October of 2021 and ended on the last day of November 2021 raising a cumulative total of **\$206,191**.



Spring - Summit Gala

Ray Ray McElrathbey featured in the Disney Plus movie *Safety* rocked the stage with his truly raw story of hope and resilience. Over 375 Summit supporters dressed to impress for this remarkable even of giving back. The event raised over *\$525,000* to promote community mental wellness throughout the neighborhoods of North Metro Atlanta.

The 16th Annual Summit Golf Classic took place on June 20th, 2022 at Country Club of the South. The tournament raised a Summit record-breaking of **\$117,000** to support the vital mission of The Summit Counseling Center.


